Greetings,

"For judgment is without mercy to one who has shown no mercy. Mercy triumphs over judgment." James 2:13

They say first impressions are everything. The way that someone sees you the first time you meet them tells them everything they need to know about that who you are. While there should be a priority on making a good first impression, this method of sizing up people based on their appearance and initial interaction alone is lazy and selfish. I say this because I was once the biggest culprit.
