Meanwhile, we connect through electronic means, phone, email, etc.

Our church is in the habit and practice of ministering to itself. It is like a human body that naturally heals itself of many maladies. Each member of the church has a deacon assigned to you who prays for you and seeks to minister to vou. Also, each member is encouraged to participate regularly in a Sunday school class.
